9th Grade In-Class Resource (Inclusion) English I:

- The assignment asks you to read one of the chosen books, please rely on MAP scores sent home to give you your Lexile range. Choose that book that is within your Lexile range. You can use LEXILE.com to find out the range of those books.
- The assignment asks you to complete 10 double entry journals. You will have to complete FIVE Double entry journals.
- Your responses will be rated by a grading rubric associated with the summer assignment. The modified rubric will be as follows:
 - Length: 3-5 Sentences- 10 points
 - Completion: Turn in on time: 10 points
 - Coherence: Easily read and understood responses- 10 points
 - Effort: Assignment is handed in complete- 10 points
 - Literary Analysis: Interpretations give details and are thoughtfully explained- 10 points

Modifications to 2018 Summer Reading Assignment
10th Grade In-Class Resource (Inclusion) English II:

- The assignment asks you to read one of the chosen books, please rely on MAP scores sent home to give you your lexile range. Choose that book that is within your lexile range. You can use LEXILE.com to find out the range of those books.
- The assignment asks you to complete 10 quotes in a double entry journal. You will have to complete FIVE quotes. You will be expected to write a minimum of 3-5 sentences that explain how the quote illustrates the theme.
- The modified grading rubric will be as follows:
 - Length: Minimum of 3-5 sentences per quote- 100 points.
Under 3 sentences is 0 points.
 - Coherence: Easily read and understood- 100 points
 - Connection, Explanation and Accuracy: Quotes are valid, make sense, explanations are rational and relevant. -100 points
 - 50 points- Quotes are valid, partially relevant and accurate
 - MLA Guideline:
 - Times New Roman 12 point font, follows MLA style
 - EXAMPLE OF A QUOTE USED WITHIN A TEXT
“The narrative . . . is not linear, but alternates between the insistent portrayal of the dominant event in the plot—the actual physical displacement of the people—and paintings dealing with the main causes of this mass migration” (Adams 505).

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Modifications to 2018 Summer Reading Assignment
11th Grade In-Class Resource (Inclusion) English III:

The original assignment asks you to do a Pre-Reading section: This will be omitted for the modified version- YOU DO NOT HAVE TO DO THIS SECTION.

ACTIVE READING SECTION: Modifications-

The original assignments says to identify and use 10 quotes in a double entry journal. You will have to do FIVE quotes.

With the quotes, you will have to produce 4 sentences minimum and choose to answer 5 out of the 8 prompts the selected quotes. You are not limited to which prompts you can use for each quote.

The grading rubric for this summer reading assignment will be as follows:

- 2 points for valid quote that is cited correctly
- 4 points for a minimum of 4 sentences per quote and that addresses the 5 selected prompts
- 1 point for a valid quote not cited correctly
- 2 points for 4 sentence response that does not address at least 5 prompts

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Modifications to 2018 Summer Reading Assignment
12th Grade In-Class Resource (Inclusion) English IV:

- The assignment asks you to complete 10 quotes in a double entry journal. You will have to complete FIVE quotes.
- On the right side of the double entry journal, you will respond to any of the listed prompts for any of the FIVE quotes you have selected.

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
